### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

The Centre for Human Rights and Peace Advocacy (CHRAPA) is an independent, non-governmental, non-partisan, non-sectarian human rights organization established in May 2001. It is a national organization with international dimension. Its current membership is 150 people. The centre has been monitoring, documenting and following up human rights violations in Cameroon since creation. It has a Special Consultative Status with ECOSOC of the UN. In accordance with this status CHRAPA has designated permanent representatives to the UN Head Quarters in New York and UN Offices in Geneva and Vienna and attends UN Conferences and Meetings. The organization submits Quadrennial Reports, written statements and make oral presentations in UN conferences and meetings. CHRAPA also entertains good collaboration relationship with the Cameroon National Commission on Human Rights and Freedoms. It plays a leading role in the Cameroon Coalition of Organizations for Voluntary Development, CAVOD and the Union of Northwest Human Rights Organizations, UNHURO, a network of more than 25 accredited NGOs. The organization may affiliate/collaborate with other national and international institutions with similar goals and objectives.

#### B. Goal

Our institutional goal is to promote sustainable development by pressing forward for greater respect of human rights and peace which are vital ingredients for good governance and hence development. To achieve these goals our work centers mostly on promoting the following Sustainable Development Goals (SDGS) SDG 1, SDG 5, SDG 10 and 16 and other cross-cutting Goals by working in collaboration with communities, grassroots institutions and organizations both at the national and international level.

# **Objectives:**

- Increase access to justice and other legal services to the common man through education and awareness raising within the local population in favour of human rights and peace.
- Empower the woman for sustainable development and other vulnerable groups with special focus on children.
- Monitor and follow-up the respect of Human Rights, good governance, and democratic evolution in Cameroon.

#### What we do

## 1. Promotion of human rights

We promote human rights through awareness raising by carrying out human rights awareness within communities, use of different media outlets for sensitization -radio, TV and Print Medium.

## 2. Protection of Human Rights

We carry out protection/human rights monitoring and where violation are identified, we support victims for legal redress and for other protection assistance where and when necessary. We also carry out monitoring in detention centres and irregularities are reported to the authorities that be.

## 3. Lobbying and Advocacy

We lobby competent public authorities to follow up, ratify and implement UN human rights instruments and redress victims of gross human rights violations. We issue press releases and Communiqués on striking issues, bulletins and fact sheets, flyers and publication and a quarterly newsletter called 'The Advocate' and organization of side events in UN Conferences on different advocacy issues.

### a. Who are our Clients

We work with vulnerable men, women, children, persons with disabilities and other minority groups.

### D. Funding

Members' dues and registration constitute an emerging though fragile source of funding. Our counterpart fundscome from local contributions and donations; sale of publications, legal fund and interest earned. A majority of our projects are realized through the support of national and international partners.

# **Reporting:**

CHRAPA's reporting procedure is both internal and external. Internal reporting is generally monthly for internal use only. Project, Activity, Quarterly, Annually and Human rights specialized reports and the financial reports that go with each item. External reporting is generally quarterly for partners and other stakeholders.

# **Networking With Other Organizations:**

At the national level, CHRAPA has good working relationship with the National Commission on Human Rights and Freedoms, is member of the Union of Northwest Human Rights Organization (UNOWHURO) and chairs the Presidency of this Union. It plays a key role in the Cameroon Coalition of Voluntary Organizations for Development, CAVOD. At the International level CHRAPA is a member of the World Alliance of Religions.
